CPUC 2024 Year-End Financial Report

- We end the year with a net income for the first time in over five years!
- Donations received were down from budget expectations by \$6.3K and were down from last year's actual collections by \$500. Rentals soared over budget by \$26K and were \$30K over last year's actual. Of total rental revenue, U-Turn accounted for 21% while the Winnipeg Woori Church accounted for 18%.
- Expenses overall are below budget expectations.
- M&S is above budget due to donated amounts directed by donors to M&S in addition to the contribution of 7.5% of general donations.
- A grant from the Winnipeg Foundation for \$15,000 was received in late June. These funds are in support of the Ad Hoc Committee funding research initiatives for future building uses and potential collaborations. While the amount is reflected in cash flow, it is being recorded as deferred revenue and, therefore, a separate statement will be provided once use of the grant funding commences.
